

Lesson: Introduction to the Advanced 100 Word Hop

Grade Level: 2nd Grade

Concepts: Reading; Sight words

Duration: 20-30 minutes

Objective: Students will improve their word recognition skills by actively engaging in a

movement-based reading activity.

Materials Needed:

Advanced 100 Word Hop

Tape

Lesson Procedure (5 minutes):

Engage Students:

• Ask students, "What are some fun ways we can learn new words?" Discuss movement and how it can help with learning.

Explain the Activity:

Tell students they will read words while jumping on them.

Demonstrate the Activity:

Show how to jump on a word while reading it aloud.

Activity (15-20 minutes):

Student Participation:

- Have one student step up to the Advanced 100 Word Hop.
- The student reads the first word.
- The student jumps on the word while saying it out loud.
- If the student doesn't know the word, tell them the correct pronunciation.
- The student continues jumping and reading until they reach the end of the mat.

Repetition & Mastery:

- Repeat the activity multiple times.
- Allow students to take turns.
- Gradually increase speed or look for patterns or vowel sounds for a challenge.

Closure (5 minutes):

Discussion:

• Ask students what words were tricky and discuss any patterns they noticed.

Reflection:

• Have students share if jumping helped them remember the words.

Celebrate Progress:

Praise students for their effort and improvement.

Assessment:

• Observe students' reading accuracy and fluency.

Differentiation:

Support:

• Offer one-on-one guidance or have them only jump one row.

Challenge:

• Have them use the word in a sentence after jumping.

Extension Activity:

 Have students create their own word sheets when they spot one of the words from the mat in a book or around the classroom.
