

Lesson: Introduction to Question Word Hop Mat

Grade Level(s): 2nd Grade

Concept(s): Question words, reading, interrogative sentences

Duration: 25-20 minutes

Objective: Students will recognize and practice using question words (Who, What, Where, When, Why, How, Which) through an engaging floor mat activity that reinforces reading and

comprehension skills.

Materials Needed:

- Question Word Hop
- Flashcards with simple questions
- Tape
- Optional: A small beanbag or soft object

Lesson Procedure (5 minutes):

Engage Students:

- Ask: "Can you think of any question words? Let's brainstorm some that we know!"
- Write down the ones the class comes up with. Circle the ones that are on the mat.

Explain the Activity:

- Gather around the mat. Point out the question words the class came up with that are on the mat. Read the other words on the mat not mentioned.
- Who, What, Where, When, Why, How, Which
- Briefly explain what each word is used for with simple examples:
 - Who Asks about a person (Who is your friend?)
 - What Asks about a thing or idea (What is your favorite color?)
 - Where Asks about a place (Where do you live?)
 - When Asks about time (When is your birthday?)
 - Why Asks for a reason (Why do we wear a jacket in winter?)
 - How Asks about the way something happens (How do you tie your shoes?)
 - Which Asks about a choice (Which do you like better, cats or dogs?)
- "You'll be jumping on these words, reading them, and making or answering your own questions for each."

Demonstrate the Activity:

Jump down the mat, reading each word as you jump on it.

• Toss a bean bag onto the mat, jump to the word, say it, and make a question using it.

Activity (15 minutes):

Student Participation:

- Have students line up at the beginning of the floor mat.
- One by one, students will hop from word to word, reading each question word aloud as they land on it.
- After every student has hopped down the mat, have each student take a turn tossing a bean bag on the mat, jumping to the word, saying it, and making a question using it.

Repetition & Mastery:

- Repeat the activity multiple times, allowing each student to take several turns to reinforce familiarity with question words.
- Pair students up and have them take turns hopping and asking each other questions to promote peer interaction and deeper understanding.
- Provide positive reinforcement and corrective feedback to ensure students confidently recognize, read, and use question words accurately.

Closure (5-10 minutes):

Discussion:

- Ask:
 - "Which question words do you remember?"
 - "Can you think of a question using one of these words?"

Reflection:

 Play a quick "Question Word Charades" where one student picks a word, acts it out, and the class guesses.

Celebrate Success:

Congratulate students on reading these tricky words!

Assessment:

- Observe students as they read and identify question words.
- Observe if they are using the words correctly to form a question.
- Encourage students to use the words in their own questions.

Differentiation:

Support:

Provide visual aids or sentence starters to help them form questions (e.g., "Where is _?").

Challenge:

• Create more complex questions or use multiple question words in a sentence.

Extension Activity:

• Instead of hopping, students can skip, tiptoe, or balance on one foot to each word.
