

# Lesson: Introduction to TH Word Hop

Grade Level(s): 2nd Grade

Concept(s): Reading, TH words, Commonly confused words

**Duration: 25-30 minutes** 

Objective: Students will improve their recognition and pronunciation of commonly confused

sight words that begin with th by engaging in an interactive hopping activity.

### **Materials Needed:**

TH word Hop

Tape

# Lesson Procedure (5 minutes):

### **Engage Students:**

 Ask: "Have you ever mixed up words that look or sound alike? Today, we will practice some tricky words in a fun way, by hopping on them!"

### **Explain the Activity:**

- Students will start at START HERE.
- They will jump onto the first box and say the word aloud ("the").
- They continue hopping and reading each word in order until they reach the last word.
- If they don't know a word, they can listen to the teacher or peers and try again.

### **Demonstrate the Activity:**

Show students how to jump and say each word clearly.

# Activity (15-20 minutes):

### **Student Participation:**

- One student at a time hops through the word mat, saying each word as they land on it.
- If they mispronounce a word, they listen to the correct pronunciation and try again.
- Continue until all students have had a turn.

### Repetition & Challenge:

- Repeat the activity until students feel comfortable with the words.
- Make it a team relay by having students hop through the words in pairs or groups.

Add a speed round for an extra challenge.

# Closure (5 minutes):

### **Discussion:**

Ask students which words were tricky and how they can remember them.

### Reflection:

• Have students share if hopping helped them remember the words better.

## **Celebrate Progress:**

• Praise students for their effort and improvement.

### **Assessment:**

• Observation: Listen to pronunciation and check for word recognition.

### **Differentiation:**

### Support:

• Provide extra practice by reviewing word meanings and pronunciations before hopping.

### Challenge:

 Have them spell each word before jumping or use each word in a sentence after hopping.

# **Extension Activity:**

Students write sentences using the words from the activity.
